


Trail Blaze Guide

Five separate parcels, forming a contiguous expanse of 196 acres, are collectively referred to as Boulder Knoll. The property terrain ranges from open rolling fields to a minor basalt trap rock ridge.

Public parking is available at the former barn site on the south side of Boulder Road and at the property kiosk.

The Red Trail is accessible from the driveway to the left of the kiosk, following the farm road along the west side of the trap rock ridge.

Please respect the private residences along the trail and leave plants and animals undisturbed in their natural habitat.




